

Of 183 Omicron cases analysed, 87 fully vaccinated: Govt

NEW DELHI : Out of the total 183 Omicron cases in India analysed so far, 87 cases have been found fully vaccinated and out of these, three were also given the booster dose, the Union Health Ministry announced on Friday.

Of the total, 61 per cent of the Omicron cases analysed were male and 39 per cent were female.

Addressing a press briefing on the current Covid pandemic situation in the country, Union Health Secretary Rajesh Bhushan said that India has so far reported 358 cases of Omicron and out of these, 114 have recovered.

He further added that an analysis of 183 Omicron cases was done which revealed that 121 cases had history of foreign travel, 44 had no foreign travel history, but the majority of them were in contacts of the foreign travellers. However, 18 patients have no travel information yet, he said.

About the vaccination sta-



tus of these analysed Omicron cases, Bhushan said that 87 patients were fully vaccinated and out of these, three were inoculated with the booster dose. Out of these three with booster dose, two patients are from Delhi and one from Maharashtra.

Seven patients were unvaccinated and two were partially vaccinated and 16 were ineligible to take the jab. The vaccination status of 73 patients is unknown, he

said. "The world is witnessing the fourth surge and the overall positivity is 6.1 per cent. Therefore, we have to be on guard and we can't afford to loosen our guards", said Bhushan, adding that while Europe, North America and Africa are seeing an increase in Covid cases week-on-week, Asia is still witnessing a decline in Covid cases week-on-week.

About the government's preparations, he said that, as

on Friday, 18,10,083 isolation beds, 4,94,314 oxygen supported beds, 1,39,300 ICU beds, 24,057 paediatric ICU beds and 64,796 paediatric non-ICU beds available across the nation. He said that India has administered the first dose to 89 per cent of the adult population and 61 per cent of the eligible population has received the second dose of vaccines.

On the question of national policy on booster dose, Indian Council of Medical research Director General, Dr Balram Bhargava, said that the deliberations are underway and the scientific data is being reviewed to formulate a policy.

"The predominant strain is Delta including the recently identified clusters. Therefore, we need to continue with the same strategy of Covid appropriate behaviour and ramping up of vaccination," he said. "We are testing the efficacy of the vaccines against the Omicron variant," he added.

Three out of 183 Omicron positive cases had taken third vaccine dose: Health ministry

NEW DELHI : The Union Health Ministry on Friday said that of the 183 Omicron positive cases reported in India, three patients have already taken three doses and 121 had a foreign travel history.

Addressing a press briefing, Union Health Secretary Rajesh Bhushan said, "During analysis of 183 Omicron positive cases 121 had a foreign history, 44 cases have no travel history but most of them are those who came in contact with those who have travel history. 87 people were fully vaccinated, three people were those who received three doses and amongst them two are from Delhi and one is from Maharashtra." Bhushan further said that the vaccination status of some patients is under tracking and some were unvaccinated. "Seven people unvaccinated, two people amongst them partially vaccinated, 16 Omicron positive patients were ineligible and 73 are those whose vaccination status is unknown.

13 new Omicron cases mount Gujarat's tally to 43

GANDHINAGAR : Gujarat on Friday reported 13 new Omicron cases, taking the state's tally of the new Covid variant to 43.

Of the new cases, 7 were reported from Vadodara, followed by 3 in Kheda, 2 in Ahmedabad and 1 in Anand.

The patients infected with Omicron had returned from

the UK, Tanzania, Zambia, the UAE and Nigeria. Of the total 43 cases in the state, 8 have been discharged after testing negative. The state also reported 98 fresh Covid-19 cases and 3 deaths in the 24 hours ending 5 p.m. on Friday against 69 recoveries. The state presently has 694 active Covid cases, of which 8

are on ventilator support. Ahmedabad reported most Covid cases on Friday at 32, followed by Surat (18), Vadodara (10), Rajkot (7), Kutch (6), Valsad (5), Kheda and Rajkot (3 each), Navsari, Sabarkantha, Vadodara, Gandhinagar and Junagadh (2 each), and Bhavnagar, Jamnagar.

To avoid night curfew, tourism industry should cooperate with govt: Goa CM

PANAJI : Tourism industry stakeholders should cooperate with the Goa government to urge tourists to follow Covid-19 protocol, maintain social distancing and wear masks, so that we do not have to impose a night curfew like in other states, Chief Minister Pramod Sawant said on Friday.

Speaking to reporters here, Sawant said that the state was witnessing a surge in tourist footfalls on account of the festive season of Christmas and New Year.

"This is the festive season in Goa. From Christmas to January 1, there is an atmosphere of excitement. There is a lot of crowd on the occasion of Christmas in several parts of Goa as well as in Churches, coastal areas and beaches. We have to follow Covid protocol, wear masks and maintain social distancing," Sawant said.

"I have a request for all tourism industry stakeholders. We should work in such a manner that we do not have to impose the night curfew. We should co-operate with the government, while ensuring that the tourist season is not disturbed," Sawant said. The Chief Minister added that while not a single case of Omicron was detected in the coastal state, a high-level meeting would discuss the issue soon.Sawant said that the state government's Covid management taskforce was scheduled.

Delhi Police tightens noose on hotels violating Covid norms; restaurant sealed

NEW DELHI : A restaurant was sealed in south Delhi's Mehrauli area for violating the Delhi Disaster Management Authority's guidelines, an official said here on Friday.

"The restaurant named Diablo was found violating DDMA guidelines," Additional DCP South M Harshwardhan said.

He informed that there was excessive overcrowding in the restaurant after which it was sealed. The police have registered an FIR under sections 188 (Disobedience to order duly promulgated by public servant) and 269 (Negligent act likely to spread infection of disease dangerous to life) against the estab-



lishment at the Mehrauli police station.In view of the

rising cases of Omicron in Delhi, the Delhi Disaster

Management Authority (DDMA) had reduced the capacity at public places like restaurants, auditoriums and assembly halls to 50 per cent, while gatherings at wedding functions was capped at 200 persons to curb the spread of the new Covid variant.

There will be a ban on all kinds of gatherings on Christmas and New Year in the national capital. However, it said that all religious places will remain open on December 25 and 31.The order had further asked the district magistrates to survey the areas falling within their jurisdiction and identify the places, which have the potential of

becoming Covid hotspots and tighten the enforcement machinery by deploying sufficient number of enforcement teams on field for keeping vigil at public places and for enforcing Covid appropriate behaviour."All district magistrates as well as DCPs shall conduct surprise checks and raids in their respective areas and shall take strict penal action against the defaulters," the DDMA had stated. India's series of interventions arrest domestic spike in palm oil prices

NEW DELHI : Even though the prices of Malaysian crude palm oil shot up sharply, the price of the Indian product did not follow the same trend in 2021 due to the government's intervention.

Widely used in edible oil blending, cosmetics, processed food products, and even in biofuel, palm oil's prices on Bursa Malaysia Derivatives is considered to be the global benchmark among trade circles.

Crude palm oil prices on

the BMD rose 27 per cent during the year-to-date period in 2021 to around 4,949 ringgits (Rs 88,443), while on Multi Commodity Exchange of India, it rose just over 10 per cent to Rs 1,115 rupees per 10 kg.

The steady and inconsistent rise in prices on the MCX, to an extent, can be attributed to the Indian government's slew of interventions. In June, the Central government removed import restrictions on refined bleached deodorised palm oil, refined bleached deodorised palmolein, and another variant (palm oil and its fractions, whether or not refined, but not chemically modified) till December 31, 2021, which has now been extended till the end of 2022.Besides, it on Monday reduced the basic customs duty on refined palm oil from 17.5 per cent to 12.5 per cent till March 2022 as part of the measures it is taking to bring down edible oil rates in the

Indian markets.

With this duty cut, net effective duty comes down to 13.75 per cent against 19.25 per cent earlier, according to industry players.In addition, the government on Monday suspended trade in futures contracts of several

agricultural commodities, including of crude palm oil, for one year.

Macro-data, released earlier this month, showed that higher prices of commodities, food items and fuels lifted India's November consumer and wholesale inflation numbers. CPI inflation jumped to three-months high of 4.9 per cent which was led by higher core inflation.At present, India imports a large chunk of edible oil requirements from Malaysia and Indonesia, the two major producers of the oil palm.

Oil palm kernel is crushed to extract crude palm oil and subsequently processed to make refined palm oil.

India reports 6,650 new Covid cases, Omicron tally rises to 358

NEW DELHI : India registered 6,650 new Covid cases and 374 deaths in 24 hours, said the Union Ministry of Health and Family welfare on Friday morning. The tally of Omicron cases in the country rose to 358. With the addition of the new deaths, the toll has climbed to 4,79,133. The Omicron infection tally has climbed to 358 across the nation. However, out of total Omicron positive, 114 have been discharged. So far 17 states have reported Omicron infection, said the Union health ministry.The recovery of 7,051 patients

in the last 24 hours has increased the cumulative tally to 3,42,15,977. Consequently, India's recovery rate stands at 98.40 per cent, highest since March 2020.India's active case-load is presently at 77,516. Active cases constitute 0.22 per cent of the country's total positive cases, which is the lowest since March 2020.Also in the same period, a total of 11,65,887 tests were conducted across the country. India has so far conducted over 66.98 crore cumulative tests. Meanwhile, the weekly positivity rate at 0.59 per cent has remained less than 1

per cent for the last 40 days now. The daily positivity rate stands at 0.57 per cent, which has also remained below 2 per cent for the last 81 days and less than 3 per cent for 116 consecutive days now. With the administration of 57,44,652 vaccine doses in the last 24 hours, India's Covid inoculation coverage has reached 140.31 crore as of Friday morning. More than 17.97 crore balance and unutilised Covid vaccine doses are still available with the states and union territories to be administered, according to the health ministry as of Friday .

It is the responsibility of India to contribute in terms of spirituality to nations, says PM Modi

NEW DELHI : It is the responsibility of India as a spiritual leader to contribute in terms of spirituality to nations across the globe, said Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday.

PM Modi said this today while chairing the first meeting of the High-Level Committee (HLC) which has been constituted to commemorate the 150th Birth Anniversary of Sri Aurobindo in a befitting manner. The notification of HLC was issued on December 20, 2021. The Committee comprises 53 members from various walks of life. Secretary (Culture), Govind Mohan, gave a presentation on the Road Map for the celebration of the Commemoration and sought an advise of the esteemed members for celebrating the 150th anniversary of Sri Aurobindo in a befitting manner.

Speaking on the occasion, the Prime Minister expressed his gratitude to the esteemed members for their valuable

thoughts and suggestions on Sri Aurobindo's Commemoration. The Prime Minister said that the two aspects of Sri Aurobindo's philosophy of 'Revolution' and 'Evolution', are of key importance and should be emphasized as part of the commemoration.

"The youth should be encouraged towards the concept of greatness as embodied in the philosophy of Nar to Narayan to create a MahaManav as propounded by Sri Aurobindo," he added.

The Prime Minister further said that it is the responsibility of India as a spiritual leader of the world to contribute in terms of spiritualism to nations across the globe. He suggested that 150 universities across the country should be involved in writing papers on different aspects of Sri Aurobindo's life and philosophy and the 150 papers to be published on the occasion. The Prime Minister proposed to launch the commemoration celebrations of Sri Aurobindo

from Puducherry coinciding with the celebration of National Youth Day. This will encourage the youth to visit Puducherry and learn about his life and teachings, where Sri Aurobindo spent his life from 1910 .
