

# Reports alleging ‘vaccination fraud’ misleading: Centre

NEW DELHI : The Union Health Ministry on Thursday said that some reports in the international media alleging a "vaccination fraud" and further claiming that people are being fraudulently registered as double vaccinated without receiving both doses are misleading and completely ill-informed.

"There have been some media reports in international media alleging a 'vaccination fraud' and further claiming that people are being fraudulently registered as double vaccinated without receiving both doses. These reports have also alleged that the vaccination 'figures were being manipulated'. It is clarified that such media reports are not only misleading but are completely ill-informed, and without any basis," said the ministry in a statement.

The ministry clarified that the beneficiaries have been empowered to make necessary corrections in their records on Co-WIN. The "Raise an issue" module in beneficiary dashboard allows the beneficiaries to make corrections apart from changes in basic demographic details like name, age, gender and photo ID."It needs to be appreciated that even with its very large population, India has successfully implemented its nationwide Covid vaccination programme.

# Covid-19 pandemic worsened cancer burden in India

HYDERABAD : On the eve of World Cancer Day, cancer specialists said that the Covid-19 pandemic has worsened the cancer burden in India during the last two years.Lockdowns and restrictions on movement during the pandemic, with difficulties in travel, combined with the fear of contracting Covid have prevented most patients from accessing cancer care.

Non-Communicable diseases account for nearly 63 per cent of the total deaths in India, and cancer at 9 per cent is one of the leading causes.

As many as 1,392,179 people in India had cancer in 2020, and the five leading sites of the disease are breast, head & neck, uterine, and lung.

Specialists point out that 94.1 in every 100,000 men are cancer patients in India, and this number increases to 103.6 in every 100,000 women. They feel that India needs to take a proactive approach towards reducing this burden.

"India is a low-middle income nation, and there is significant increase in cancer incidence and most of the patients are coming with advanced and metastatic disease due to lack of awareness. Already the government is taking necessary action to create awareness, a betterment is needed at the village and district headquarter level like online education and creating healthcare teams to tackle this problem," Dr Madhu Devarasetty, Senior Consultant Surgical Oncologist, KIMS Hospitals told IANS.

According to a study published by the Lancet, one of the leading platforms for

healthcare and research, cancer services like new patient registrations, outpatient services, admissions to hospitals, major cancer surgeries have all fallen in India starting March 2020.

Lockdowns and restrictions on movement and fear of contracting Covid have prevented many to access cancer care.Added to this, some hospitals had to be converted to Covid centres desperately and with several hospital staff affected with Covid themselves, reduced resources for cancer care have made things difficult.

"This situation, though has gradually improved in 2021, we observe that the fear of Covid-19 has kept away many patients at home and then, presenting at advanced cancer stage or with multiple uncontrolled comorbidities which need to be treated along with cancer treatments thereby increasing risks and also a delay," observed Dr M Srinivas Reddy, Senior Consultant Surgical Oncologist.



# Delhi reports decline in daily Covid cases, deaths

NEW DELHI : Delhi on Thursday reported a considerable decline in daily Covid cases at 2,668, against 3028 cases recorded on the previous day, as well as 13 deaths, the Health Department bulletin said. The positivity rate has also reduced to 4.30 per cent with active cases declining to 13,630, as per the bulletin. With Covid recovery rate climbing at 97.84 per cent, the active cases rate stands at 0.74 per cent while the death rate continues at 1.41 per cent.

The fresh infections and deaths has taken the tally to 18,38,647, and the death toll to 25,932. With 3,895 patients recovering in the last 24 hours, the total number of recoveries has gone to 17,99,085. A total of 9,581 Covid patients are being treated in home isolation at present.

The number of Covid containment zones has also declined to 33,708. Meanwhile, a total of 61,992 new tests -- 50,536 RT-PCR and 11,456 Rapid Antigen - were conducted in the last 24 hours, taking the total to 3,50,81,270. Out of 55,232 vaccines administered in the last 24 hours, 11,395 were first doses and 37,828 second doses. Meanwhile, 6,009 precaution doses were also administered. The total number of cumulative beneficiaries vaccinated so far stands at 2,97,50,695 according to the health bulletin.

# Surgery not associated with higher complications, deaths in Covid patients: Centre

NEW DELHI : Surgery is safe in the present surge of Covid and not associated with higher chances of complications or deaths in infected patients, Joint Health Secretary Lav Agrawal said on Thursday.

Addressing a media brief, Agrawal said that the patients irrespective of Covid infection who need surgery need not to be denied surgical intervention presently in this Covid variant.

Highlighting an analysis

of surgeries during the current surge in Covid OT Cases in AIIMS Delhi from December 20, 2021 to January 20, 2022, Agrawal said that of the total 53 surgeries during this period, 32 were administered regional anaesthesia and remaining 21 were given general anaesthesia.Out of 32 cases, 26 cases were Lower Segment Cesarean Sections (LSCS). But, no complications during surgery and immediate post operative periods were found, he said. In other cases also, no deaths and complications were reported, he underlined.

Among those who were administered general anaesthesia, major cases were serious like Laparotomy, Amputation, Bone flap removal and others. But, no respiratory problems and other risks during the surgery and post surgery have been noticed in clinical data of 21 cases, Agrawal said.
